1- $4 \quad 1 c+2 c \quad 3 c+4 c$ set and link
5- $8 \quad 1 c+4 c$ circle half way to the left ending inside the set, $1 c$ facing up $4 c$ facing down $1 \mathrm{c}+4 \mathrm{c}$ set
Meanwhile $2 c+3 c$ turn right hand for 4 bars
9-10 1c make an arch with nearer hands.
$1 c+4 c$ change place ( $4 c$ dive under)
11-12 $1 c+4 c$ turn 2 hands (ending facing top/bottom)
13-16 $1 c+4 c$ dance out top/bottom, cast round corners and end in the middle facing corner
17-20 All 4 couples dance Glasgow highland step. Right and left.
But the center persons turn $\mathrm{r}+\mathrm{l}$ in the Glasgow highland step
21-22 $1 c+4 c$ turn corners with nearer hands for 2 bars
23-24 1c +4 c chase round half way anticlockwise 2 places (back to own side) Ending 2-4-1-3
25-32 $2 c+4 c$ and $3 c+1 c$ full diamond poussette

Fig.I giving right shoulders to 2 nd corners who are also on the opposite side of the dance. 1st couple finish in 2nd place on own side of dance.
$25-28$ 1st man dance right hands accross with the 3 rd couple Fig.K couple.

29-32 1st lady dance left hands across with the 3 rd couple while Fig. L 1st man dance left hands across with the 2nd couple. ist couple finish in 2nd place ready to start again.

## The Copenhagen Dragons Devised by Gary Coull

The Copenhagen Dragons are the tails of four dragons intertwined on the spire of the børsen or stock exchange building in Copenhagen.

Bars Description
1-8 $\quad 1^{\text {st }}, 2^{\text {nd }}$ and $3^{\text {rd }}$ couples set. $1^{\text {st }}$ and $3^{\text {rd }}$ couples dance a $3 / 4$ double figure of eight. To begin the $1^{\text {st }}$ couple cast off as the $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple cross up. $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple finish the double figure of eight by curving in to top place to face down.

9-16 $\quad 3^{\text {rd }}, 2^{\text {nd }}$ and $1^{\text {st }}$ couples dance a grand chain. To being $1^{\text {st }}$ couple cross over as the $2^{\text {nd }}$ and $3^{\text {rd }}$ couples change on the sides.

17-24 $\quad 1^{\text {st }}$ couple join nearer hands and dance up the middle for 2 steps. $1^{\text {st }}$ couple change places on bars 19 and 20 with $1^{\text {st }}$ man dancing above his partner who dances under his arm. $1^{\text {st }}$ couple dance down the middle and cast up to $2^{\text {nd }}$ place on their own sides.

25-32 $\quad 1^{\text {st }}$ man with the $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple (at the top) and $1^{\text {st }}$ woman with the $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple dance left hands across. With $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple following $1^{\text {st }}$ woman and $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple following $1^{\text {st }}$ man the $1^{\text {st }}$ couple pass right shoulders and 'snake' back to own sides ( $1^{\text {st }}$ man dancing down the woman's side and $1^{\text {st }}$ woman dancing up the man's side). Finish with all three couples on their own side in the order 2,1,3.

Repeat having passed a couple.

# Copenhagen reel. 

## Reel 32 bars, 3 couples in a 4 couple set

 I would like: Breckin lassiesBars $1-1^{\text {st }}$ and $2^{\text {nd }}$ couples set and, pulling back by the right cast $8 \quad$ clockwise for 4 bars, halfway around. On bar 7 and $82^{\text {nd }}$ and $1^{\text {st }}$ couples cross to own side giving right hand. $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple finish facing in and down, $1^{\text {st }}$ couple facing out ready for

Bars $9-2^{\text {nd }} 1^{\text {st }}$ and $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple dance a 8 bar right shoulder reel of 3 on 16 own side. $1^{\text {st }}$ lady starts by dancing out and down, $1^{\text {st }}$ man out and up, $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple dancing in and down. $1^{\text {st }}$ couple finish giving right hand to $1^{\text {st }}$ corner and left hand to partner, ready for:

Bars $17 \quad 1^{\text {st }}$ couple balance in line with $1^{\text {st }}$ corners. $1^{\text {st }}$ couple turn ( 4 bars) each other 1 and $1 / 4$ with left hand. Finish giving right hand to $2^{\text {nd }}$ corner and balance in line with $2^{\text {nd }}$ corner.

Bars 25- $1^{\text {st }}$ man with $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple and $1^{\text {st }}$ lady with $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple dance a 6 32 bar, left shoulder to $3^{\text {rd }}$ corner, reel of 3 across the dance. $1^{\text {st }}$ couple finish by crossing to $2^{\text {nd }}$ place own side ready to start again.

## The Dancetide strathspey 2010.

32 bars in strathspey-time for 4 couples.
Music: Heather Dewar's Strathspey

1-4 $1^{\text {st }}$ lady followed by $1^{\text {st }}$ man, also $4^{\text {th }}$ man followed by $4^{\text {th }}$ lady cast in one place. $1^{\text {st }}$ lady and $4^{\text {th }}$ man cross to opposite sides. $2^{\text {nd }}$ and $3^{\text {rd }}$ couples step in and down/ up on bars 3 and 4.

5-8 All dance $1 / 2$ reels of 4 on the sides.
9-16 Repeat bars 1-8 with $3^{\text {rd }}$ lady and $2^{\text {nd }}$ man leading. All end in partners original places.

17-24 All dance $1 / 44$-couples rights and lefts:
17-18 All cross right hands.
19-20 Dancers in $1^{\text {st }}$ man and $2^{\text {nd }}$ man places also $3^{\text {rd }}$ and $4^{\text {th }}$ lady places change places left hands on the sides, while dancers in $1^{\text {st }}$ lady place and $3^{\text {rd }}$ man place cross diagonally left hand as dancers in $2^{\text {nd }}$ lady place and $4^{\text {th }}$ mans place cross diagonally left hand.

21-24 Repeat bars 17-20. finish facing own partner
25-28 Bottom 3 couple set and cross right hands
29-32 Bottom 3 couple chase clockwise $1 / 2$ way round to finish 4123

## Milliteas.

Reel 32 bars for 3 couples in a 3 couple set danced 6 times, or in a 4 couple set see note below.
Music: Circassian circle played 6 times.

Bars 1-4 All the ladies advance for 2 bars and retire for 2 bars. Semi military looking.
Bars 5-8 All the men advance for 2 bars and retire for 2 bars. Very military looking.
Bars $9-\quad 1^{\text {st }}$ couple followed by all the next couples dance down the middle, and $1^{\text {st }}$ 16 couple followed by all the next couples cast back to original places, $1^{\text {st }}$ couple finish at the top of the set facing down, joining nearer hands.

Bars 17 - $1^{\text {st }}$ couple alone dance down below $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple and cast up around $3^{\text {rd }}$ 20 couple to $2^{\text {nd }}$ place on own side. $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple step up on bars 17 and 18.

Bars $21-1^{\text {st }}$ couple dance $1 / 2$ reel of 3 across the dance, $1^{\text {st }}$ man with $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple giving left shoulder to $3^{\text {rd }}$ lady, and $1^{\text {st }}$ lady with $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple giving left shoulder to $2^{\text {nd }}$ man. Lady up man down. Finishing in the order 213 on opposite side.

Bars 25 - A full T - pot, man up lady down. Finishing in the order 213 on opposite side. IE:
$1^{\text {st }}$ lady RH across with $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple once round, followed by LH across with $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple. While:
$1^{\text {st }}$ man RH across with $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple once round, followed by LH across with $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple.

The dance finished on the opposite side, and is repeated from the bottom. The original $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple as new $1^{\text {st }}$ couple, followed by $1^{\text {st }}$ and $2^{\text {nd }}$ couples as new $2^{\text {nd }}$ and $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple.

Strathspey, 32 bars, 3 couple dance in a 4 couple set.<br>Music:Reel Friends: Above the clouds (Of cause)

Bar 1-8 $\quad 1^{\text {st }}$ and $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple set and cast, briefly touching nearer hands with partner, the long (curving) way down behind $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple and up between $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple, $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple leading. $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple finish in $1^{\text {st }}$ place facing out, and $1^{\text {st }}$ couple finish in $2^{\text {nd }}$ place.

Bar 9-16 $1^{\text {st }}$ and $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple dance a double figure of eight. $1^{\text {st }}$ couple start crossing up and $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple cast. Finish where they started (213), now $1^{\text {st }}$ couple is facing in and down ready for:

Bar 17- $\quad 2^{\text {nd }}, 1^{\text {st }}$ and $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple mirror reel of 3 on own sides. $1^{\text {st }}$ couple in 24 and down to start. Finish same place (213)

Bar 25- Right hand across, lady up with $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple and man down with $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple.

Bar 29- Left hand across, man up with $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple and lady down with $3^{\text {rd }}$ 32 couple.

Why not a dance for a special day or every day. It's done out there, but here it is again maybe.

Pleated by Christian R Petersen to day.

## Partner race strathspey.

Strathspey 32 bars in a 4 couple set, couple 3 and 4 change sides on the second cord. Music: Castels in the air by Peter White.

Bar 1-4 $1^{\text {st }}$ man and $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple dance a half reel of 3 across, first man crossing down to start, giving left shoulder to $2^{\text {nd }}$ lady, finish in promenade hold with partner facing in. At the same time $4^{\text {th }}$ man dance a half reel of 3 across with $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple, $4^{\text {th }}$ man crossing up to start, giving left shoulder to $3^{\text {rd }}$ lady, finishing in promenade hold with partner facing in.

Bar 5-8 The half reel of 3 across continue with $1^{\text {st }}$ and $4^{\text {th }}$ couple as one person, finishing $1^{\text {st }}$ couple above $2^{\text {nd }}$ man on men's side in promenade hold facing in and $4^{\text {th }}$ couple below $3^{\text {rd }}$ man on ladies side in promenade hold facing in.

Bar 9-10 $1^{\text {st }}$ and $4^{\text {th }}$ couple dance in to meet, while $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple step up and $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple step down and finish in $1^{\text {st }}$ and $4^{\text {th }}$ position.

Bar 11-12 $1^{\text {st }}$ and $4^{\text {th }}$ couple dance right hands across halfway.
Bar 13-16 $4^{\text {th }}$ and $1^{\text {st }}$ couple dance left hands across once round.
Bar 17-20 $1^{\text {st }}$ man with $4^{\text {th }}$ lady and $4^{\text {th }}$ man with $1^{\text {st }}$ lady in promenade hold going to the right dance corner pass and turn, $2^{\text {nd }}$ and $3^{\text {rd }}$ man dance in and turn each other with the right hand ( $1^{\text {st }}$ diagonal) before dancing back to places. $1^{\text {st }}$ and $4^{\text {th }}$ couples finish meeting in the centre changing partners to $1^{\text {st }}$ and $4^{\text {th }}$ man with partners.

Bar 21-24 $1^{\text {st }}$ couple and $4^{\text {th }}$ couple in promenade hold going to the left dance corner pass and turn, $2^{\text {nd }}$ and $3^{\text {rd }}$ ladies dance in and turn each other with the left hand ( $2^{\text {nd }}$ diagonal) before dancing back to places. $1^{\text {st }}$ couple finish in the middle between $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple facing down and $4^{\text {th }}$ couple finish in the middle between $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple facing up.

Bar 25-28 $1^{\text {st }}$ couple with $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple and $4^{\text {th }}$ couple with $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple set across the dance. $1^{\text {st }}$ and $4^{\text {th }}$ couple change places giving right hand to the opposite dancer and staying in the middle:

Bar 29-32 $4^{\text {th }}$ and $1^{\text {st }}$ couple dance 4 hands round once to the left finishing in the sidelines in the order 2413.

Note Could just as well been danced in reel time! E.g.: Weary Willie's reel

Dance devised by CRP shown on the occasion of the $80^{\text {th }}$ birthday of Else Hartzberg
on February 25 year 2008, 350 years after the peace in Roskilde 1658.
Celebrated on Sunday the $24^{\text {th }}$.

## Two Towers Reel

Reel 32 bars, a 3 couple dance in a 4 couple set.
Music: Isle of Skye.

Bar 1-8 $1^{\text {st }}$ couple dance down facing out on own side, back to back, then dance a $3 / 4$ double triangle, finish in the middle facing partners side. $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple step up on 1 and 2.
Bar 9- $\quad 1^{\text {st }}$ couple dance a 8 bar reel across, $1^{\text {st }}$ lady giving right 16 shoulder to $2^{\text {nd }}$ lady and $1^{\text {st }}$ man giving right shoulder to $3^{\text {rd }}$ man. $1^{\text {st }}$ couple finish in $2^{\text {nd }}$ place opposite side lady facing down and in, man facing up and in.
Bar $171^{\text {st }}$ man dance out of the top and cast to the left, $1^{\text {st }}$ lady

- 20 dance out of the bottom and cast to the left. $1^{\text {st }}$ couple finnish in $2^{\text {nd }}$ place own side.
Bar 21 Full thepot. Lady up man down. RA and LA
- 28

Bar $292^{\text {nd }} 1^{\text {st }}$ and $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple turn once round with left hands.

## Danish Royalties

R8x40 (40 bar Reel for 3 couples) Music: Any good reel.

1-4 1C \& 2C: Set \& 4 hands-across, RH, half way
5-8 1C \& 2C: Set \& then 2C: cross back to own side, RH, while 1 C turn LH , finish facing 1st Corner
$9-12 \quad$ 1C: Turn their 1st Corners once around, RH, finish facing 1st C.
13-16 Half Reel of 4 with 1st Corner, 1C pass LS, facing 2nd Corner
17-20 1C: Turn their 2nd Corners once around, RH, finish facing 2nd C.
21-24 Half Reel of 4 with 2nd Corner, 1C finish in 2nd place opp. Side
25-28 Half Reel of 3, across, LS. 1Man with the Couple in top place
1Lady with the Couple in 3rd place
29-32 Half Reel of 3, on the sides, RS. 1C finish in 2nd place, own side.
( $2 \mathrm{C} \& 3 \mathrm{C}$ dance the half reels with a loop at the end)
33-40 1C: Dance up to the top, cast off own side, dance through 2nd place, into the middle and down to 3rd place, divide and cast up to 2nd place, own side.

Repeat, having passed one couple.

## The Everlasting Flower

A 40 bar Reel for 4 couples in a 4 -couple set
Suggested music: The Deveron Reel, $4 \times 40$
Music has two chords; on the second chord 3rd and 4th couple change over to opposite sides

## Bars

1-8 1st couple with 2nd couple, and 3rd couple with 4th couple: set on the sides, then right hands across once around (stay in the middle), then 1st and 4th couple cast one place down or up (initially lady holds on to partners right hand and pivot on the spot), while 2nd couple and 3rd couple lead up or down one place.

The order is now: $2,1,4,3$
9-12 1st and 4th couples: right hands across, 1st Man and 4th Lady finish facing up and 4th Man and 1st Lady finish facing down.

13-16 1st Man and 4th Lady, dancing in tandem, dance a half Reel of Three on the side, with 2nd Man and 3rd Lady, as follows (as in Pelorus Jack): 1st Man, followed by 4th Lady, passes left shoulder with 2nd Man, then they turn about by the left in corner position to change direction. 4th Lady, followed by 1st Man, passes left shoulder with 3 rd Lady. Corners (2nd Man and 3rd Lady) dance loops at the end of the half reel. (the ordes is now on the men's side: 3rd Lady, 1st Man, 4th Lady and 2nd Man)

4th Man and 1st Lady do the same thing with 3rd Man and 2nd Lady, that is: 4th Man and 1st Lady, dancing in tandem, dance half a Reel of Three on the side, with 3rd Man and 2nd Lady, as follows (as in Pelorus Jack): 4th Man, followed by 1st Lady, passes left shoulder with 3rd Man, then they turn about by the left in corner position to change direction, 1st Lady, followed by 4th Man, passes left shoulder with 2nd Lady. Corners (2nd Lady and 3rd Man) dance loops at the end of the half reel (the order is now on the ladies' side: 3rd Man, 1st Lady, 4th Man and 2nd Lady)

17-20 1st and 4th couples: left hands across, 4th Lady and 1st Man finish facing down, and 1st Lady and 4th Man finish facing up.

33-40 1st and 4th Ladies change places, giving right hand (two bars) not releasing hands, while 1st and 4th Man set on the spot, then
1st and 4th couples dance right hands across, half way (two bars), at the end dancers hold on to partner's hand, and "flow" into 1 st and 4 th couples turn partners once around with right hand (four bars). The order is now: $2,4,1,3$.

Repeat from new positions.
Devised by Gunnar Numeus, Teacher of RSCDS Gothenburg Branch in May 2004, as a tribute to Lise Nordal Rückert, Certified Teacher, for her relentless effort in promoting Scottisch Country Dancing in Gothenburg, especially amongst young dancers, always bringing the standard of dancing to a very high level among the Branch members. Combining dancing with a good spirit and a good laugh has always been a landmark of hers. Revised August, 2017.

This dance will also describe her professional work as designer, where she expressed beauty and good taste in designing bouquets of dried flowers in her gift shop.

## Mr Stack[ing's Rant

Rant 1 a romp, boisterous or riotous merry-making; 2 a festive gathering with music and dancing; 3 a lively tune or song, especially one for an energetic dance.

Reel for 3 couples
Suggested music: Aileen's Reel
CD: Dance to the Pipes, Bill Clement

1-8 First and second couples dance a double figure of eight. First couple start by crossing down, second couple by casting up. Second couple finish facing out.

9-16 First couple dance down the middle, cast up around third couple, dance up in the middle to first place and cast off to second place. Meanwhile, second couple cast up to first place and follow first couple to finish on first place facing out.

17-24 First man dances a reel of three with second and third women while first woman does the same with second and third men. First couple start by crossing down below third couple giving right hands. Third couple start by dancing up and out, second couple by dancing down and out. All join nearest hands with partner where possible. Second and third couples finish facing out ready to continue with another reel.

11-14 $\quad 1^{\text {st }}$ couple release left hands and dance right hands across, woman with $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple and man with $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple.

15-16 $\quad 1^{\text {st }}$ couple turn right hands once round while $2^{\text {nd }}$ and $3^{\text {rd }}$ couples retain right hand hold and cross over to the opposite side.

17-18 All set, $1^{\text {st }}$ couple retain right hand hold while joining left hands with $2^{\text {nd }}$ and $3^{\text {rd }}$ couples ready for hands across.

19-22 $\quad 1^{\text {st }}$ couple release right hands and dance left hands across, woman with $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple and man with $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple.

23-24 $\quad 1^{\text {st }}$ couple turn right hands half way round to end side by side facing down the set while $2^{\text {nd }}$ and $3^{\text {rd }}$ couples retain left hand hold and cross over to their own side but remain facing out.

25-30 Mirror Reels of Three. $1^{\text {st }}$ couple dance down the middle to begin, $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple start out and up and $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple start out and down.

31-32 $1^{\text {st }}$ couple cross down to third place giving right hands, while $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple cast up to second place to finish the reel and $3^{\text {td }}$ couple use the two bars to dance a polite turn in place.

Repeat with new top couple twice more.

Dance devised by Mats Melin for Anders and Susanne Gjörling, April 2017.
Anders and Susanne met in the Stockholm Scottish Country Dance Club in 1969. Susanne had been dancing then for a while and Anders was a drummer in the newly formed Thistle Pipe Band. 33-40 Modified Crown Triangles: $1^{\text {st }}$ man join hand with $3^{\text {rd }}$ couple and $1^{\text {st }}$ Woman join hands with $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple, Set 1 PdB and make a quarter turn to the $L$ in the middle on the second $P d B$, so that $1^{\text {st }}$ Man face and join hands with the women and $1^{\text {st }}$ Woman face and join hands with the two men. Repeat the above movement pattern twice more ( 1 PdB on the spot and 1 PdB to move quarter way round to the $L$, joining and letting go of hands as you move around). 1-8 1st couple turn both hands 3/4 way round then let go of hands, dance straight out towards own side (2), and cast off to 2nd place, while 2nd couple move up (2). 1s $\dagger$ couple cross up by briefly joining woman's right hand with man's left hand and 1s $\dagger$ woman dances under the joined hands, which are raised, releasing hold of hands at the point of hands reaching their highest position over head (2). 1st couple cast off to 2nd place on opposite side of the dance (2).

9-16 1st couple Petronella turn, touching open left hands briefly (a caress) in passing, to finish: 1st man between 2nd couple facing down, and 1st woman between 3rd couple facing up (2). Joining hands in lines of three on the sides, Set (2).

17-24 1st couple, joining both hands, turn $1 / 2$ way round (1), open up, to dance down the middle with nearer hands joined for two steps (2). Turn both hands $1 / 2$ way round (1), open up to dance up the dance with nearer hands joined. 2nd couple move down (2). Joining both hands again 1st couple turn each other slowly into position ready for a Half Pousette (2). 2nd couple step into the middle on bar 24 to make ready for -

25-28 1st and 2nd couples dance Half Pousette, ending with 2nd couple retiring out to first place, while 1st couple turn slowly into position for another Half Pousette with the 3rd couple. 3rd couple move in to position on bar 28.

29-32 1st and 3rd couples dance Half Pousette. Finish in the order 2, 3, 1.
Repeat the dance twice more.

1-8 $\quad 1^{\text {st }}$ couple with $2^{\text {nd }}$ and $3^{\text {rd }}$ couples dance $1 / 2$ reels of three on opposite side of the set and then on own side ( $1^{\text {st }}$ couple start by crossing to second place opposite side)
9-16 1st and 3rd couples dance a reverse or left shoulder reel of four up and down the middle of the set, starting with men dancing up and ladies dancing down passing partners by the left (start the reel from the sides)
$17-241^{\text {st }}$ and $3^{\text {rd }}$ couples do a $13 / 4$ turn for four bars, cast down on opposite side below $2^{\text {nd }} / 4^{\text {th }}$ couple and cross up to places
25-32 $1^{\text {st }}$ couple cast 2 places for two bars ( $2^{\text {nd }}$ and $3^{\text {rd }}$ couples move up), dance in to touch nearer hands (man's right, lady's left) and cast to $4^{\text {th }}$ place ( $4^{\text {th }}$ couple moves up) for two bars and turn or spin partner right hand for four bars*
*The right hand turn can be as many times as the dancing couple wishes and manages, spinning or birling is quite acceptable.

Finish in the middle of the Set facing each other up and down the dance.
25-32 5C dance La Baratte to change places.*
33-40 5C with L hands still joined, Set; 3/4 turn $L$ hands; Right Hands Across (5M with 4C and 5W with 2C).

41-48 5C turn $L$ hand 1 3/4:
Right Hands Across (5M with 1C and 5W with 3C).
49-56 Reel of Three: 5 M with 4 M and 2 W and 5 W with 2 M and 4 W ). 5 s give $R$ shoulder the man in their reel to begin (5M to 4M and 5W to 2M).
Finish in the middle of the Set facing the 1C. All couples take Allemande hold (or if preferred Promenade hold).

57-58 5C and 1C change places passing by the Left.
59-60 1C and 2C change places passing by the Left.
61-62 2C and 3C change places passing by the Left.

63-64 3C and 4C change places passing by the Left. 4C dance straight in, releasing $L$ hands, Man turns his partner under his R arm in to starting position.

Repeat 4 more times with a new couple taking up the middle position.
*La Baratte (The Churn): 8 bars - couple facing each other up and down the dance, join R hand and Set (2); half turn with R hand (2); retain R hand hold and arm's length from each other; couple rotate anti-clockwise as woman turns to right dancing under man's $R$ arm man passing behind woman and join $L$ hands as well when crossing back to starting position and releasing $R$ hand woman turns to right dancing under Man's $L$ arm (2); keep hold of $L$ hands and half turn to change places (2).

25-28 1s couple dance up and cast off into 2nd place on opposite side. 4 s dance down and cast up into 3rd place on opposite side. Meanwhile 3s +2 s set twice.

17-18 1s and 2s cross RH.
19-20 1st man and 2nd lady cross, RH while 1st lady and 2nd man set
21-22 1 s and 2 s cross RH
23-24 1st man and 1st lady cross LH, while 2s set
25-32 1s and 2s dance the Tournée

## St Magnus Reel

Reel, 3 Couple Set. 64 Bars.
Tune: Sandy Lamb's Polka (J A S Garson) played AABBAACC.

## Bars

1-4 1 s cross over giving R hand, Cast off to $2^{\text {nd }}$ place. 2 s move up.
5-8 1 W cross down between 3 s and cast up round 3 W and dance in to face $1^{\text {st }}$ corner. 1 M cross up between 2 s and cast off round 2 W and dance in to face $1^{\text {st }}$ corner, passing partner by the left.

9-12 1 M dance round $1^{\text {st }}$ corner position by the right, dance up the middle and turn right about to face down between the 3 s , while 1 W does the same round her $1^{\text {st }}$ corner, dancing down the middle and turn right about between the 2s. 1s back to back in the middle facing up or down. Meanwhile $1^{\text {st }}$ corner turn each other by the R hand once round and back to places.

13-16 1 s dance round partner's $2^{\text {nd }}$ corner in the same manner, to end up back to back in the middle facing own side, while $2^{\text {nd }}$ corners turn right hand once round.

17-24 1 s dance 'Crown Triangles' with 2 s and 3 s . 1 s finish facing down in the middle (1W turn halfway by right round on last PdB. 2s and 3 s face up at end.

25-32 'Chasing Reel of Three across the dance' (Orkney Reel): 1s give R shoulder to 2 M and 3 M . (1W chasing 1 M ; 3 M chasing 2 M ; 2 W chasing 3 W ).

33-40 Reels of Three across the dance; 1W with 2 s and 1 M with 3 s .
41-44 1M three $R$ hands across with 2 M and 3 M ; and 1 W three L hands across with 2 W and 3 W .

45-48 Change over to the other wheel: 1 W in front of 1 M ; then 2 W in front of 2 M ; and $3 W$ in front of 3 M .

49-52 1s followed by 2 s and 3 s dance down the middle (nearer hands joined).
53-56 All turn inwards and 3 s followed by $2 s$ and $1 s$ dance up. $3^{\text {rd }}$ cross over and cast off on bar 55 (woman in front) and $2^{\text {nd }}$ couple do the same on bar 56.

57-60 1s cross and cast on bar 57, all enter wheels on the own side, men $L$ hand wheel and women R hand wheel. End in order 2, 3 and 1.

61-64 All turn partner by the R hand once round.
Repeat twice more with a new top couple each time.

## STOCKHOLM CEILIDH

Jig 40 bars for 3 couples. Can be danced $3 \times 40$ in a 3-couple set.

Music: Melin's Rant (Troy McGillivray), An Eilean Ard, Stockholm Branch Ruby Jubilee (M Georgii), Pat and Al's (Liz Carroll)

1-2 1st couple set advancing, to join nearer hand and face down between 2 nd couple.
3-4 1st couple dance down the middle, while 2 nd couple move up.
5-6 1st couple cast up on their own side round 3rd couple to second place.
7-8 1st couple advance to the middle with 2 Pas de Basque to join left hands with each other and right hands with their 1 st corners.

9-10 Balance in line with first corners.

11-12 Balance in line with second corners. All release hands at end of bar 12.

13-16 1 st couple cast right shoulder back and dance round following each other in the middle $11 / 4$ times to end up with 1st woman facing 1st corner with 1st man behind her. At the same time 2nd and 3rd couples dance Half Rights and Lefts.

17-20 1 st couple dance Half right shoulder Tandem Reel of Three with 3rd woman (in 1st woman's first corner position) and 2nd man (in 1st man's first corner position).

21-24 1st couple (1st man now in front) dance Right Three Hands Across with 2nd woman (in 1st woman's second corner position).
25-28 1st couple with man still leading, dance Half left shoulder Tandem Reel of Three with 3rd man (in 1st woman second corner position) and 2nd woman (in 1st woman's second corner position).

29-32 1st couple (with woman leading) dance Left Three Hands Across with 3rd woman (in 1st woman's first corner position. 1st couple finishing back to back in the middle facing their first corners.

33-38 1st couple dance Hello and Goodbye Setting to first and second corners, ending with 1st man between 2 nd couple at the top facing down and 1st woman between 3rd couple facing up. (Optional hand movements: join left hand with 1st corner right hand on bar 33, join hands with both corners on bar 34-35, retain right hand with 2 nd corner on bar 36 as you move into the middle, join left hands with corners on bar 37-38 as you move to the in between position between the couples.)

39-40 1st couple turn Right Hands $3 / 4$ to second position on own sides.

Repeat from second place, or move to the bottom of a three-couple set. Dance devised by Mats Melin, June 2016.

A 'Ceilidh' is Scottish Gaelic means 'a gathering' but also place where you share community news and skills. This dance symbolizes my own learning of social skills growing up in the Scottish Country Dance environment in Stockholm. You meet and travel to the gathering, you say hello (1-16), you interweave and increase your social and community skill set (17-32) and you say hello and goodbye until the next time (33-40).

This dance is dedicated to the Scottish Country dancers in Stockholm, past and present, on the 40th Anniversary of the Stockholm Branch of the RSCDS, June 2016.
